INTRODUCTION

This handbook is designed to inform members and parents/guardians of the policies and procedures of the Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies. This handbook contains rules by which the Club operates and helpful hints that will make a members experience more enjoyable. Each member and parent/guardian must review this handbook as a condition of membership.

Unless otherwise specified, the contents of this handbook shall apply to all members of the Platte Canyon Clubhouse, the Boys & Girls Club of South Park, and any other youth development programming or outreach offered by the Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies. The terms the "Boys & Girls Club" and the "Club" refer to all sites within the Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies.

The Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies is a non-profit youth service organization that seeks to inspire children from all backgrounds to embody the qualities necessary in becoming responsible, caring citizens and leaders. The purpose is to promote personal growth in young people by instilling a sense of purpose, encouraging positive social interaction, and providing diverse experiences. Funding for programs comes from memberships, business and individual contributions, government/state grants, special events, and activity fees for specific programs.

Five Key Elements for Positive Youth Development

- Creating a safe, positive environment
- Having fun
- Developing supportive relationships with caring adults
- Offering opportunities for and having high expectations of members
- Recognizing members for who they are and their achievements

Our Club offers programs and activities in three core areas:

- Academic Success
 - o Tutoring, educational programing, and technology resources.
- Healthy Lifestyles
 - Triple Play (mind, body, and soul), and outdoor activities
- Good Character & Citizenship
 - Life skills, community service, and career development.

PARTICIPATION

Members are encouraged to participate in the programs and activities scheduled. It is highly encouraged for parents/guardians to consistently communicate with staff about their child's engagement in programming, positive performance, and areas needing improvement. The Club is dedicated to introducing children to a wide array of programs to help develop the whole child. The Boys & Girls Club is a club for youth 5-18 years of age that focuses on youth development. Club membership is contingent upon following the Club rules. Potential Club members who are 5, may be asked to come to the club on a trial basis to see how they handle the structure of the club.

SERVICES OFFERED FOR SPECIAL NEEDS

If you need special accommodations, we will work with your family to create an accommodation plan. Please contact the Unit Director at either the South Park or Platte Canyon club to discuss more details.

CHILDREN'S LOCATIONS

Staff will know which designated area members are in at all times. Our attendance manager (Trax) will be up to date, with which Members are in the care of the club (both on-site and off-site for field trips).

MEMBERSHIP AND FEES

Membership is open to all youth between the ages of 6 and 18. A current membership form must be completed and signed by a parent or guardian prior to youth attending. Membership fees are determined by each site. *Please view your site's membership information for more details*. Scholarships are available for those who qualify. The scholarship application must be completed in full to be eligible for scholarship. Most families qualify for some assistance. Refunds cannot be issued for membership fees paid in advance.

CLUB HOURS

The Club reserves the right to change its hours and days of operation based on need and/or economic circumstances. If such changes occur, parents/guardians will be notified in advance. Additionally, there may be days when it is necessary to close the Club due to unforeseen circumstances such as emergency repairs, inclement weather, etc. To mitigate any inconvenience this may cause, schedule changes and closure information will also be posted our each Club's Facebook page. Be sure to follow these pages for important updates.

HOLIDAYS AND CLOSURE DATES:

Generally, the club is closed for winter break, open for spring break, closed for 1 week before/after summer, and closed for federal holidays. Closure Dates:

DROP OFF AND PICK UP

Please note that youth are not allowed on the Club's grounds during operating hours unless they are signed in and participating in Club activities. **Members CANNOT be dropped off prior to the opening of the Club, as the Club cannot be held responsible for the supervision of such youth.**

Members will only be released to the people who are authorized for pick-up. If you need someone who is not on your list of people approved ot pick-up, Please notify the club of the changes, the new person must be able to show a photo ID to verify their identity.

Be sure to pick-up your child by the posted closing times. Late fees will be charged for members left after closing. We may charge \$1.00 for every minute the member is left at the Club after closing. The Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies reserves the right to contact local authorities for assistance if a Club Member has been left for over an hour, the member's guardian remains unreachable or uncooperative, AND all emergency contacts have been exhausted.

INCLEMENT WEATHER CLOSURE POLICY

If there is deep snow, high wind, or ice, the Club may open late, close, or close early for everyone's safety. As a general rule of thumb, the Club will be delayed or closed if Platte Canyon School District or Park County RE-2 Schools are delayed or closed. If there is a high probability of Highway 285 closing, the Club will also likely be closed. In the event of a delayed opening or early closure, we will contact parents/ guardians as soon as possible. Please monitor the Facebook page for delayed start and closure information and have a plan in place for inclement weather closures.

FIELD TRIP /FEES

Field trip fees are not included in membership fees, and they must be paid by the member. Some field trips may require that the member has attended the Club a minimum number of times to qualify. Field trips that are farther than 12 miles from the Club require special permission slips. These spots are on a first come, first serve basis. Sign-up sheets are put out a week before the trip at the front desk. The parent/guardian must sign up in person and pay the trip fee at that time (no phone calls please). Swimming fees must be paid on the day of these activities. It is highly recommended that members grade 5 and under do not bring any money over \$2 dollars to the Club, unless there is a scheduled field trip or other special circumstance.

CLUB RULES AND ETHICS

Respect the club, yourself, and others.

Keep your hands to yourself.

Use appropriate language.

Clean up after yourself.

Follow all directions given by all staff and junior staff.

ZERO TOLERANCE POLICY

The following behaviors will automatically result in a minimum one day suspension:

- -Fighting -Stealing
- -Bullying -Damage to BGCHR facility
- -Threatening the safety of a BGCHR member or staff
- -Possession of alcohol, tobacco, illegal material, or weapons

Depending on the severity of the incident the suspension can be elevated to any level including membership revocation.

VEHICLE SAFETY

Members must follow certain rules when riding in the Club vehicles. They are expected to keep their seat belt on at all times, and remain in their seat while sitting properly (not turning around, putting their feet on the seat in front of them, etc.). Members must not be distracting to the driver, and are never permitted to be in a Club vehicle without a staff member present. Disobeying these rules could result in a suspension of the privileges of riding in Club vehicles.

SUPERVISION

A staff member or trained volunteer will oversee each of our designated program areas at all times. Please take the time to remind your child of the need to follow Club rules and direction at ALL TIMES, whether said directions are given by a staff or volunteer.

Members will have access to technology while at the Club. Staff will supervise these times, but it is the responsibility of the Member to make sure they are using the technology appropriately and not watching inappropriate videos or playing inappropriate games. If a member is found to be violating these rules, they will be suspended from technology.

VISITORS

All visitors and volunteers must be background checked before they are allowed around the Members. Visitors and volunteers must sign in and sign out at the front desk.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

The Boys & Girls Club of the High Rockies strives to keep the consequences for unacceptable behavior clear, appropriate, and timely. The safety of all members is of utmost importance to us. Our standards, along with the expectation that all members use good common sense, exist to ensure that your child and every other child at the Club can safely enjoy the Club's activities. Any member who disrupts programs or creates a dangerous situation will be disciplined appropriately. Members who do not follow rules can expect to lose privileges and face consequences. First-time offenses are never excused and will be handled based on their severity. Parents/guardians will be called to remove any member who has failed to curb his or her disruptive behavior and/or is behaving in an aggressive or violent manner that creates a dangerous situation for themselves, fellow members, staff or visitors. If you are called to pick up your child for discipline reasons, it is your responsibility to pick him/her up as soon as possible or an emergency contact will be called.

Disciplinary actions may include, but are not limited to, the following:

Verbal Counseling

Time-out

Parent meeting or phone call

Loss of Club privileges

Suspension (one day to two weeks)

Expulsion (permanent suspension)

Contacting the proper authorities

Members are expected to respond to any disciplinary action without incident. Failure to do so will almost always increase any action taken in time or severity. Staff members are trained and fully expected, by policy, to maintain full control of any situation that occurs in their program area and will not tolerate any behavior that threatens that control or prevents other members from getting the full Club experience. Club staff have the right to refuse membership, and entry into the Club, to your child because of disciplinary problems.

PROPERTY DAMAGE

The parent or guardian will assume the financial responsibility for repair for any damage to Club property including vehicles caused by their child.

OPEN DOOR POLICY

The Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies has an OPEN DOOR POLICY. This policy allows members to come and go at any time during the Club's operating hours. Members are NOT required to sign out with a staff; and staff members, under normal circumstances, are not allowed to prohibit a member from leaving the facility per the regulations of the Department of Health Services that govern facilities/programs exempt from licensure as child cares. Thus, it is the responsibility of the child AND parent/guardian to determine, understand and enforce whatever arrival and departure methods they see fit. Please note that youth are not allowed on the Club's grounds during operating hours unless they are signed in and participating in Club activities. Members CANNOT be dropped off prior to the opening of the Club, as the Club cannot be held responsible for the supervision of such youth.

ACCIDENTS

The Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies staff work hard to create a safe and secure environment. The completed membership application authorizes the staff to obtain medical treatment for a member, if necessary. When a serious injury occurs, the staff calls the parents or emergency contact person immediately. If they cannot be reached, treatment may be provided, but only if deemed necessary by an EMT or physician. Please contact the Club if you have any changes in work or home phone numbers, alternate contact people, or other emergency numbers. Minor injuries, such as cuts and scrapes, will be treated on site.

MEDICATION POLICY

The Club will dispense prescribed and over-the-counter (OTC) medicine to members, **ONLY** after receiving the Medication Administration Permission form. This form must be signed by the parents and a healthcare provider. Prescribed and OTC medicine must be provided in their original containers, and be labeled with the member's name. Only staff who have completed the Medication Administration Training (MAT) and have been delegated will be allowed to administer medicine to members. Medicine will be stored in an area that is inaccessible to children. If a member plans on carrying their own emergency Asthma or Allergy medicine, they must have an approved Self-carry Medication Contract. All staff are first aid and CPR certified in case of emergency.

FOOD

The Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies understands and appreciates the need for a healthy diet among all of our members. It is our goal to encourage healthy eating habits that promote the wellbeing of our youth. **On full days, a packed lunch is required and 3-4 snacks are suggested.** Water is available at all times to your child, but a water bottle (with your child's name on it) is required.

SICK POLICY & 'BATHROOM ACCIDENTS"

The Staff will notify a parent/guardian if a member becomes ill while he/she is at the Club. Arrangements MUST be made to have the member picked up as soon as possible after notification. Any member exposed to a contagious disease will be allowed back into the Club only after official authorization from a physician. **DO NOT send a sick child to the Club- PLEASE make other arrangements.**

Any member who has a "bathroom accident" involving soiled clothing while at the Club will be provided clean clothes to change into. The soiled clothes will be put into a plastic bag and given to parents at the time of pick-up. Please wash the borrowed clothes, and return them to the club.

INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY: In the event of a delayed start, the club will be open from 7am until the school opens and drop off attending members at the school. In the event of a closure for the whole day the club will also be closed. If weather requires a delayed start on an early release day, the district has been known to close for the whole day. In the event of a delayed start on an early release day resulting in a full closure of the school district for the day, the club may or may not be open based on staff availability. Updated information regarding the club's operating hours during times of inclement weather will be communicated to the school district and posted on the club's Facebook page.

OTHER INFORMATION

Please see monthly calendar for programming. Space is sometimes limited. Some programs may be provided outside regular programming hours. Some programs may require a fee and/or pre-registration.

PHONE CALLS

The Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies allows members to use landlines at any time to reach a parent or guardian. This is the preferred method of communication (vs. cell phones). If it is a problem for your child to call you while you are at work, it is the responsibility of the child AND parent/guardian to determine.

DRESS CODE

Youth should dress comfortably and wear clothes that allow them to participate in typical Boys & Girls Club activities and programs. **Closed toed shoes such as tennis or walking shoes are required.**

Inappropriate clothing of any kind is NOT allowed in the Club. Members wearing clothes that are too short, too tight or too revealing in any way or clothes with questionable or distasteful advertising will be asked to change immediately. If the member does not have a change of clothes, and the Club does not have temporary clothes for them to wear, then a Club staff will contact the parent/guardian to bring different clothes. This judgment will be left solely to the discretion of the Club staff.

Summer Requirements: It is required to provide your child with a water bottle, hat/sunglasses, backpack, closed-toed walking shoes, appropriate clothing, and jacket/rain gear during summer camp.

PERSONAL BELONGINGS

All personal belongings brought into the Club by a youth are the responsibility of that child. The Boys & Girls Club is NOT responsible for lost, damaged, or stolen items. Club members in grade 5 and younger are discouraged from bringing their own toys or electronics. Personal electronics must be stowed away at all times unless a staff gives permission. Items that your child brings to the Club should be clearly marked with their name. Items that are not collected from our lost-and-found in a timely fashion will be donated to a local charity.

PARENT/GUARDIAN CODE OF CONDUCT

The staff at the Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies is happy to help parents/guardians with any questions, concerns or suggestions. We realize that a parent needs to feel his/her child is receiving the best possible programs in a safe environment and has the right to inquire about and observe the facility. Any questions or complaints should be first addressed with the Unit Director at the site (Platte Canyon - Jessica, plattecanyon@bgchr.co; South Park - Gavin, programs@bgchr.co). They will be happy to address the concerns or set up a meeting for further review of the situation. If you are unsatisfied with the response or actions taken by the Unit Director, the Chief Executive Officer (Amy, ceo@bgchr.co) will be happy to address the concerns. Any persons who engage in disorderly conduct of any kind, such as use of speech/language that is offensive/inappropriate and/or physical/verbal abuse or threat of harm to any staff/volunteer/member will be subject to removal and possible exclusion from the facility.

Data Collection

School Information

The purpose of the exchange is to help both organizations do a better job of helping the student be successful in school, in the Boys & Girls Club and in his/her daily life. This release is valid for the current membership year and may be limited or revoked at any time by contacting the Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies in writing.

Data Sharing

I understand that the Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies may share information about the minor child listed on this application with Boys & Girls Clubs of America (BGCA) for research purposes and/or to evaluate the program's effectiveness. Information that will be disclosed to BGCA may include the information provided on this membership application form, information provided by the minor child's school or school district, and other information collected by Boys & Girls Clubs of the High Rockies including data collected via surveys or questionnaires. All information provided to BGCA will be kept confidential.

Technology
